



The Sustainability Literacy Test (SuLiTest) was launched in late 2013 by Kedge Business School in France. It contains knowledge-based, multiple choice questions covering, economic, social and environmental aspects of sustainability. Participants are presented with 50 randomly selected questions (30 international and 20 regionally specific).

The questions have been customised for 17 countries and in 8 languages. There have been contributions from 200 volunteers; 430 Universities are registered to administer the Test and as of May 2016, the Test has been taken by 44,000 students in 48 countries. There are also 10 corporate and academic partners and an IT partner. Key stakeholders include; academics, students, professional bodies, employers, discipline groups.

Over the last year, the UK and Ireland Sulitest Steering Group have been working together to develop regional questions (to compliment and contextualise the international questions) for version 2 of the test (launched in September 2016). The main improvements for version 2 aim to;

- Integrate a more systemic approach to sustainability literacy,
- Create questions that work towards revealing desirable sustainability mindsets
- Provide basic feedback to users taking the test in “learning mode”.

The Steering Group is drawn from representatives of PRME (Principles for Responsible Management Education) the EAUC (Environmental Association for Universities and Colleges) and the NUS (National Union of Students) and is regionally representative (i.e. England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales).
